OUR AIMS

At St. Philip and St. James Playgroup we believe that in a happy and secure environment young children learn how to socialise and co-operate with others.

We encourage their development by following the Early Years Foundation Stage with a big emphasis on learning through play and developing their social skills.

They will be encouraged to be confident within the playgroup not only as an individual but also with their peers.

ADMISSION POLICY, TIMES and FEES

Our Playgroup is open to all families in our community. We have procedures in place to accommodate the individual needs of the children and their families and everyone is welcome.

We accept children from 2 years 6 months through to school age.

Fees are £3.60 per hour and our opening times are as follows:

FUND RAISING AND SPECIAL EVENTS

We have various events throughout the year to try and raise funds to buy the children new equipment. This is normally in the form of a sponsored event but we also have coffee mornings where you can meet other parents and experience some of the activities your children do – all are welcome at these events so feel free to invite grandparents and friends.

The playgroup try to join in local events such as the carnival and the flower festival as well as having our own events at Christmas, Easter and Summer. For all these events to be successful we do need the support of our parents but these activities are normally very rewarding for both the children and the parents.

OTHER INFORMATION

Children are welcome to bring in a named water bottle to playgroup so they have access to a drink at any time (water only please).

During a morning session the children can have a snack and a drink of either milk or water. To keep costs down we ask parents to bring in some fruit or raw vegetables (carrot sticks/cucumber etc.) in a named bowl.

Children are welcome to chop up soft fruit i.e. banana/strawberries for themselves.

All children coming to the afternoon sessions need to bring a packed lunch in a named lunchbox – no sweets, fizzy drinks or peanuts (including peanut butter) please.

Children are welcome to stay for the whole day on Thursday and Friday.

All children in our setting can claim the Nursery Education Grant. Parents can claim up to five free sessions a week the term after their child's third birthday. Two sessions may be claimed in one day if you would like your child to stay for a full day.

ILLNESS AND INFECTION

If your child is unwell please do not bring them to playgroup.

Any child that has suffered from sickness or diarrhoea should not return to playgroup for 48 hours.

If your child is going to be absent through sickness then please ring to inform us and if your child has an illness or infection that is contagious such as chicken pox or head-lice then it is important to let us know so we can inform other parents.

CLOTHING

All children are required to wear plimsolls for safety reasons and it is advisable to wear comfortable clothes so the children can safely play on the physical equipment. Please also bear in mind the children will be painting, gluing and enjoying various messy activities.

All items of clothing should be named.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) ensures that the special educational needs of children are met. We work closely with parents and have access to outside agencies who can make their expertise available to all. Parents are fully informed, consulted and involved in all programmes of support.

RECORD KEEPING

Photographs and written records of the child's day at playgroup will be taken to show the various activities as part of our record keeping. It is a requirement that we keep records of achievement for those children who become eligible for funding. You are welcome to look at your child's records at any time.

KEY WORKER SYSTEM

A Key Worker has special responsibility for a group of children. Parents and children will know the name of their Key Worker from the beginning of their involvement with the playgroup. The Key Worker ensures the individual needs of the child are recognised and assists with the settling in of the child into the group.
